## COLONEL LYN D. SHERLOCK

Colonel Lyn D. Sherlock is the commander of the 60th Air Mobility Wing, Travis Air Force Base, Calif. She is responsible for the combined efforts of all operations and support activities associated with the worldwide air mobility mission. The 37 C-5 and 27 KC-10 assigned aircraft participate in airland and aerial refueling taskings, responding to Joint Chiefs of Staff-directed combat operations, and supporting U.S. State Department-sponsored humanitarian relief efforts worldwide. The general is responsible for ensuring the readiness and well being of nearly 23,700 active duty, Reserve and civilian personnel and their families.

Colonel Sherlock graduated from Columbiana High School, Columbiana, Ohio, in 1978. The colonel earned a bachelor of science degree in 1982 from the United States Air Force Academy, and a master of aeronautical science from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in 1993.



Colonel Sherlock was commissioned as a second lieutenant in 1982, and is a command pilot with over 3,500 hours in the T-37, T-38, C-141B, and C-17.
